Thank you to all of the parents that completed our recent SEND questionnaire. The results of the questionnaire help us to gather parents' views and inform SEND targets for the school. 15 questionnaires were completed by parents.

Summary of results:

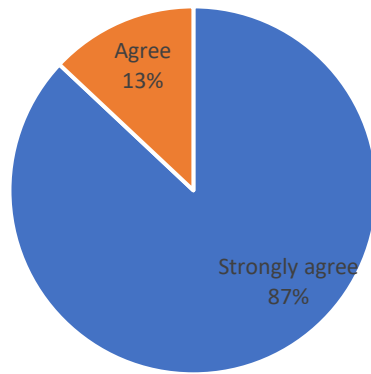
- 100% of parents said that members of staff are friendly and approachable.
- 100% of parents said that their child feels safe and happy at school.
- 93% of parents said that they would know who to contact if they had concerns over their child's learning or personal development.
- 93% of parents said that the school plans opportunities for them to discuss the individual needs of their child with their class teacher.
- 80% of parents said that SEND parent meeting take place every term.
- 100% of parents said that their views are reflected in their child's pupil passport.
- 100% of parents said that their child's pupil passport provides them with ideas to support their child at home.
- 100% of parents said that they are informed about interventions that their child is accessing in school.
- 100% of parents said that they receive feedback about how their child has progressed in class and with any interventions they are doing.
- 67% of parents said that they are informed about when outside agencies are visiting their child and that they receive up to date reports.
- 100% of parents of children with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) said that they are confident that the school is providing the support outlined in the plan.
- 80% of parents said that the school's policy on SEN is clear and accessible to parents.
- 67% of parents said that the school website contains useful and essential information about SEND.
- 67% of parents said that they have opportunities to give their views regarding SEND procedures by the school.

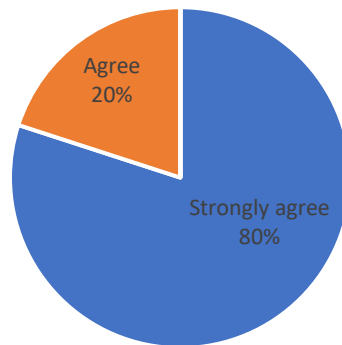

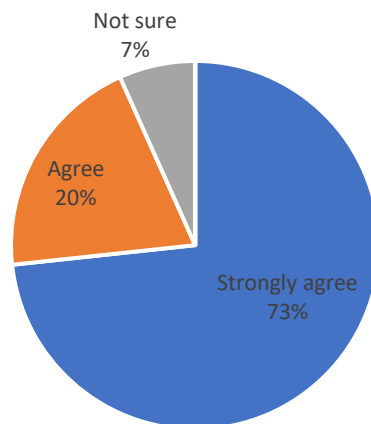

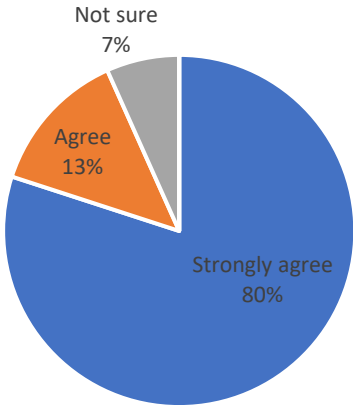
My child feels safe and happy at school.



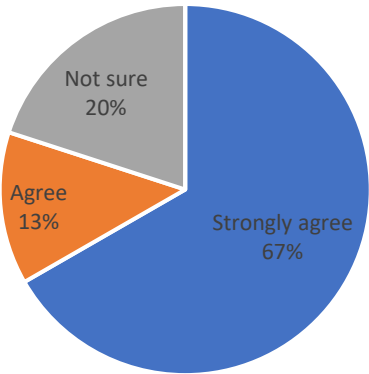
I know who I can contact if I have concerns over my child's learning or personal development.



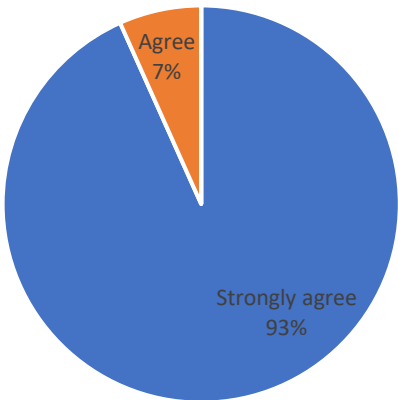
Opportunities are planned for me to discuss the individual needs of my child with their class teacher.



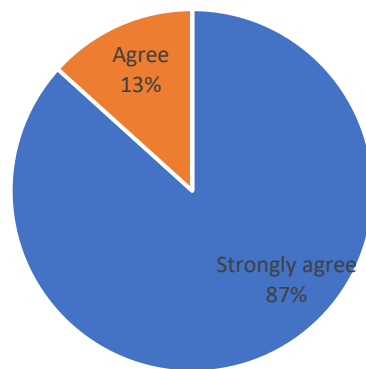
SEND parent meetings take place every term.



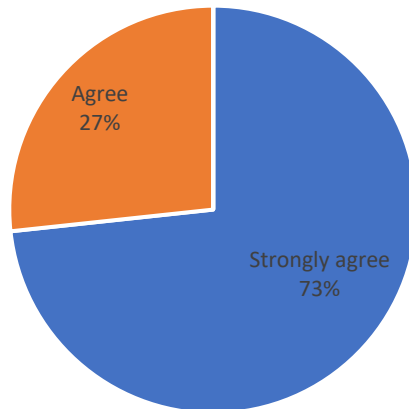
During SEND parent meetings, I am able to contribute to my child's targets/support plan and my views are reflected in their pupil passport.



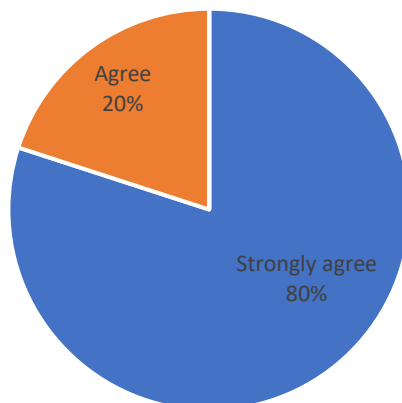
Pupil Passports provide ideas for how I can support my child at home.



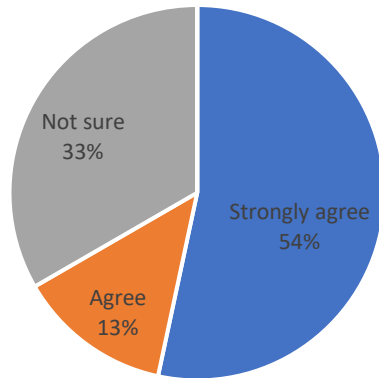
I am informed about any interventions my child is accessing.



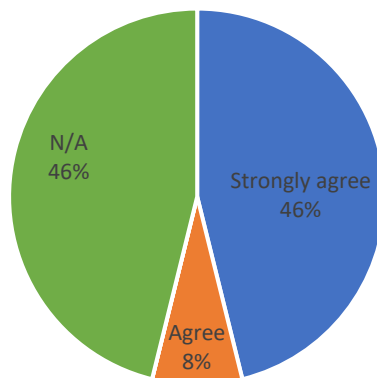
I receive feedback about how my child has progressed in class and with any interventions that they are doing.



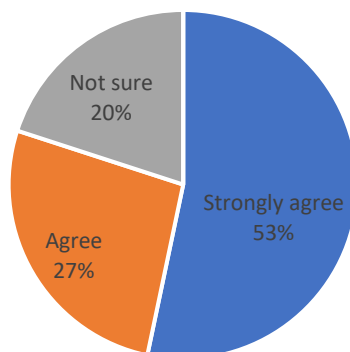
I am informed about when outside agencies are visiting my child and receive up to date reports.



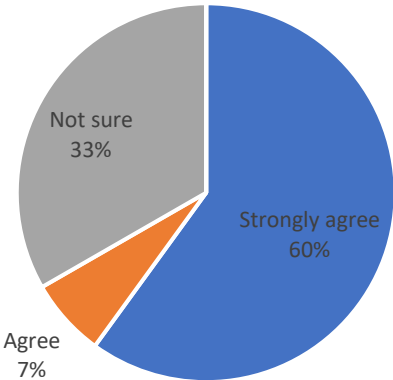
If my child has an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP), I am confident that the school is providing the support outlined in the plan.
