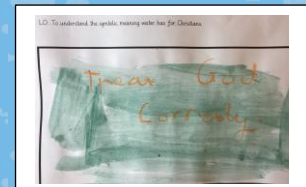
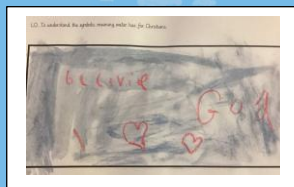
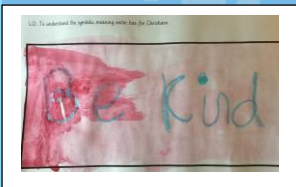


NEWS AND UPDATES:
