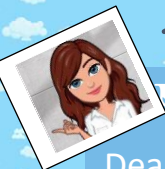

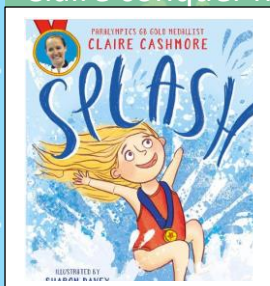

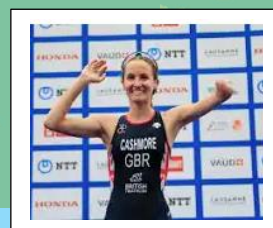
NEWS AND UPDATES: Reading Assemblies

During our reading assemblies, this week, both Mr Richardson and Mrs Sampson read the same book to both KS1 and KS2.

I chose to read the book *SPLASH* written by Claire Cashmore, MBE and Paralympic gold medalist. Claire was born without a left forearm, but she never let being different stand in the way of her big dreams. *Splash* is based on Claire's real-life experience: this gold-medal winning swimmer really was scared of water... until one day, everything changed! Can Claire conquer her fears? Can she set foot in the water – and what will happen if she does?



We watched a clip of Claire swimming in the 2012 London Paralympics where she took the silver medal in the 100m breaststroke final. A book with a truly inspirational message.' (Mrs Sampson)
