We have been without our Year 6 house point administration team, so we will have an exciting rollover week next week!



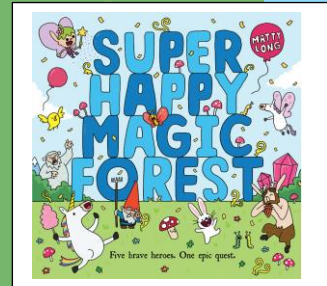
