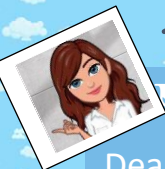

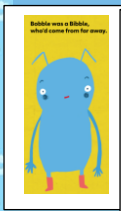
MRS MANNING'S MESSAGE

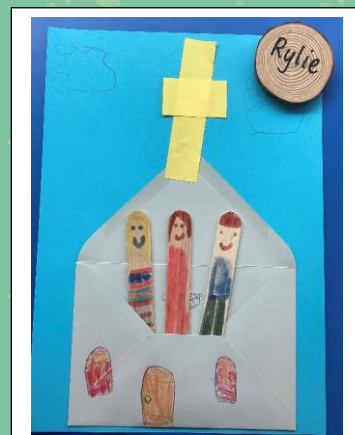
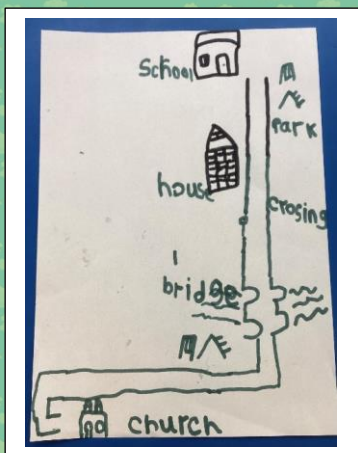

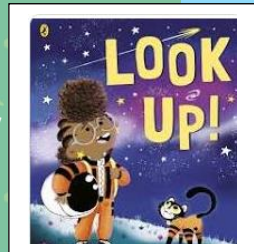

NEWS AND UPDATES: Reading Assemblies

In KS1 reading assembly, Miss Head read 'Look Up!' by Nathan Bryon and illustrated by Dapo Adeola. This was a text about a girl called Rocket, who was excited to see The Phoenix Meteor Shower. Miss Head chose this text because it is important to celebrate heroes from different genders and cultures. Rocket's brother, Jamal, is reluctant to look up from his phone and enjoy the world around him. All the town gathered together to watch the meteor shower and were mesmerized by the magical sight!



In KS2, Mrs Sampson chose 'Malory Towers, by Enid Blyton. It is a book she has fond memories of reading when she was in primary schools. She explained to the children how she loved to read about the adventures of Darrell Rivers, her friendships and the trouble she sometimes got into. The BBC adapted this book to create a TV series. Seeing this series inspired her to read it with her own child, where she got to experience the world of Mallory Towers again – midnight feasts, jolly picnics and blossoming friendships.

Year 3 have been working hard in their money unit by adding money amounts using coins to support their written methods. In 3C they did some paired maths, adding items up from a shopping list. Children were really engaged using the coins to support their learning before writing their addition as a number sentence and solving the problem.
