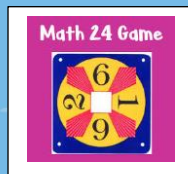
MRS MANNING'S MESSAGE

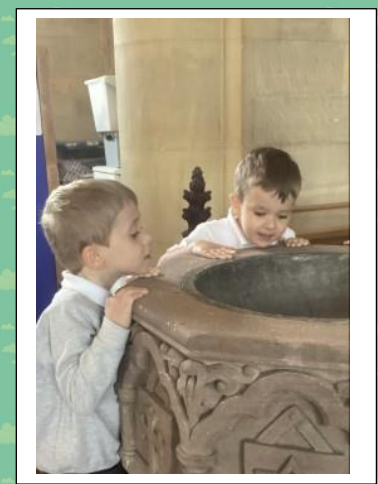

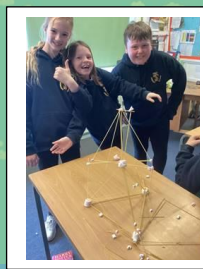

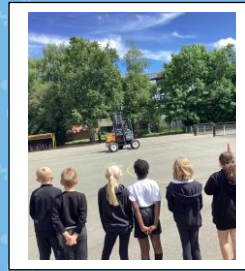
NEWS AND UPDATES: STEM Week

What a fantastic, action-packed STEM Week 2024 it's been here at Trinity. Children across the school have taken part in special science assemblies, completed practical maths activities and developed their understanding of engineering by completing the hands-on, team-based shapes challenge (KS1) and spaghetti tower challenge (KS2). Children in KS2 were fortunate enough to receive STEM talks from professionals who work in the industry, many of who are parents (and even a former pupil) within our school community. A huge thank you to David and Adam from Loadmac, Hayden from Wye Cylinder Engineering, Rita from ETL Systems and Angela from the Environment Agency for you informative and inspiring talks.

This week, Year 5 had a visit from a design engineer from Loadmac. The children were captivated in an engaging lesson on forklifts. With a wealth of experience as an engineer, he explained the mechanics and safety protocols of these powerful machines. The children listened attentively as he demonstrated how forklifts lift and transport heavy loads, emphasising the importance of precision and caution. The children were then lucky enough to see it in action!



Year 2 loved going to Grow £5 as part of our STEM week. The children were so excited to take part in all of the different activities, from penalty shoot outs to guess the name of the teddy! All of the children carefully considered which games to use their tokens on. It was lovely to see how our older member of Team Trinity encouraged all of the children in Year 2.
