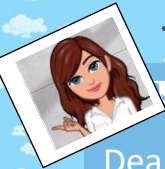

Dear parents and carers,

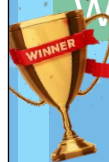

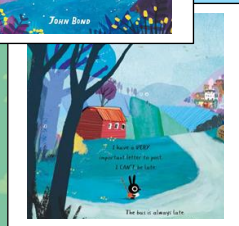

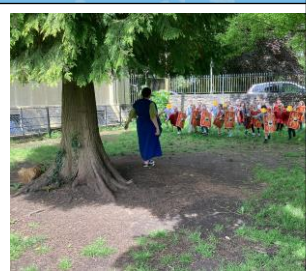

NEWS AND UPDATES:

Last Friday, Year 3 had a brilliant day at Caerleon Roman Museum and Baths. The children took part in many activities and workshops during the day. They were able to: look at artefacts in the museum, try on Roman armour, explore a replica barracks, learn about the joining criteria for the Roman army, recreate battle formations, walk around the ruins of a real Roman tour guide and explore the Baths, looking at evidence from 2000 years ago. A fun and fact filled day... the toilet related sponge on a stick was a particular favourite talking point.



In Year 5 this week, they have been focusing on activities and discussions related to their physical and mental health. On Thursday afternoon, the children talked about the importance of eating five servings of fruits and vegetables a day. They then sketched a fruit bowl from various angles around the room.
