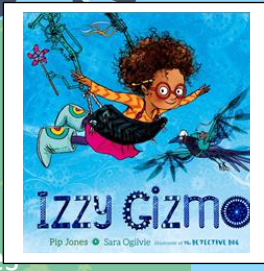

## NEWS AND UPDATES: Reading Assemblies

In KS1 reading assembly this week, Miss Bowen read the story, 'Izzy Gizmo' by Pip Jones & Sara Ogilvie. She chose this book as it links to our HEART value Of 'ambition' and teaches the children the importance of not giving up when Things are hard. The main character, Izzy, is an ambitious inventor who rescues An injured bird who can no longer fly. Izzy is determined to invent the bird some new wings but encounters some challenges along the way. But, with determination and a little bit of teamwork, a fantastic pair of wings are invented and the bird is able to fly once again!



For the KS2 reading assembly, Mr Collins shared a fairy tale with a twist based on the story of the 3 little pigs called, 'The True Story of the 3 Little Pigs'. This was written from the perspective of the wolf (Alexander T Wolf) claiming his innocence from the events involving the persecution of the 3 pigs. They discussed common themes in the fairy tale story genre and read another extract from 'Fearless Fairy Tales' written by Konnie Huq and James Kay.



## NEWS AND UPDATES:

Year 3 have been learning about seed dispersal in science this week. They had the word 'disperse' as their word of the day on Wednesday, which created great conversation. In the afternoon, they discussed the different types of seed dispersal, including, catching a ride with an animal, being eaten by animals, falling and rolling away, bursting out and by transported by water and wind. The children recognised that a sycamore is transported by wind and spotted some on the playground. The children in 3L wanted to investigate this further, so they made paper versions of the seed to recreate and understand how the seed travels. They had a great time watching the 'helicopters' fly.



The Trinity Eco Warriors have been busy bees this week, planting flowers around our school grounds. Not only do they brighten up the school, they encourage those vital pollinators to get to work! One step closer to achieving our Eco School status!
