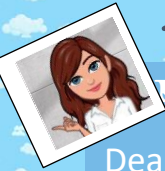

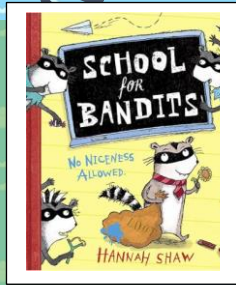

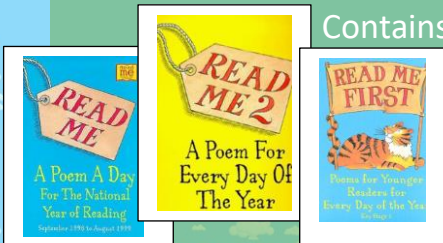
NEWS AND UPDATES: Reading Assemblies

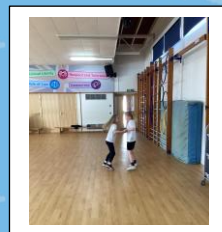
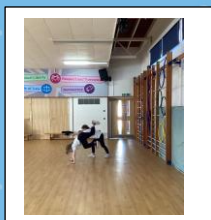
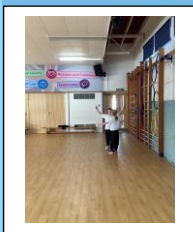


NEWS AND UPDATES:
