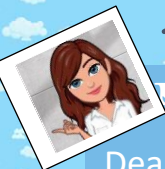

We are well and truly into the summer term with lots of great learning opportunities and engagement from the children.



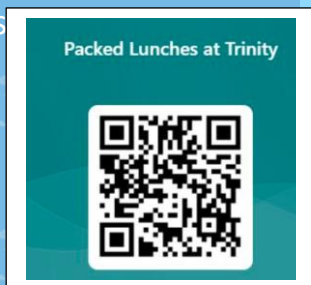
Values Festival

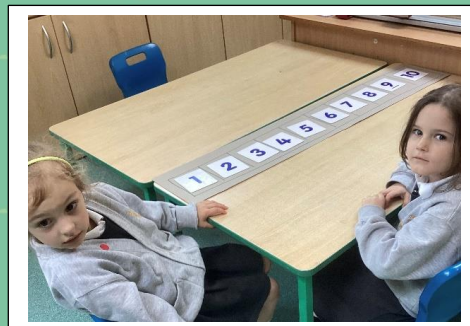

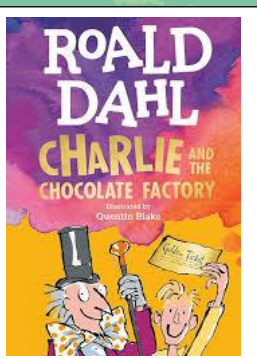
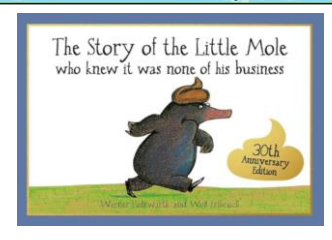
