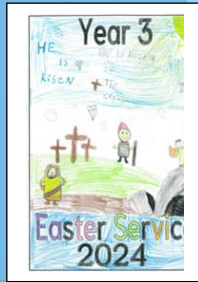
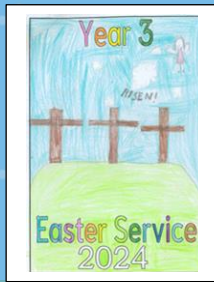
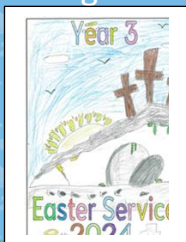
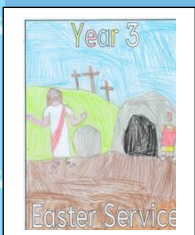
MRS MANNING'S MESSAGE

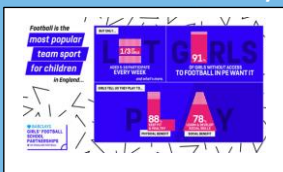
NEWS AND UPDATES:
