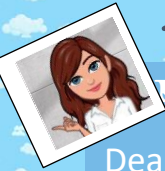

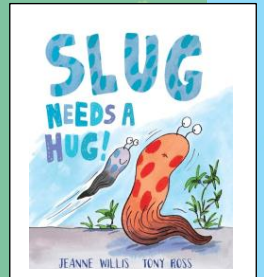

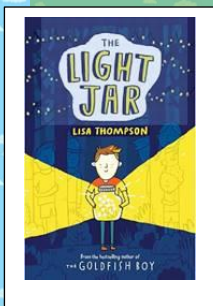


In our KS2 reading assembly, Mr Lane chose 'The Light Jar' as it has become a firm favourite among the various 'class readers' he has read over the years.

Mr Lane shared, that it is both accessible and well-written, the story is centred on a boy who is taken, in the middle of the night, by his mum to a

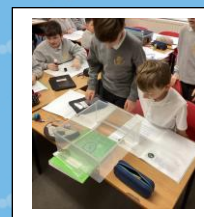
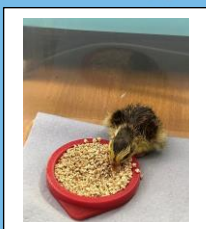

## NEWS AND UPDATES:

During this term's science topic, the children in Year 5 had a 'quail' of a time working scientifically; exploring how mammals, amphibians, birds and insects reproduce. The children have been observing the quail eggs for 18 days and on Monday, 'Peetee' hatched! The children will now spend the next few weeks observing its development into 'adulthood'. The children have also observed our 'Greenhouse Frogs' and have made comparisons between the reproduction of birds and amphibians.
