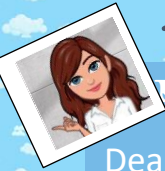

Friday 8th March on the playground we will be holding our first ever Trinted sale straight after school; come along and pick up a bargain!

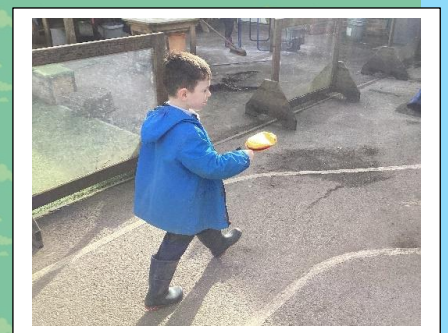
Wednesday 13th March we are hosting a Bingo Night with our star caller, Mr Goodarzi, doors open 5.30pm 😊

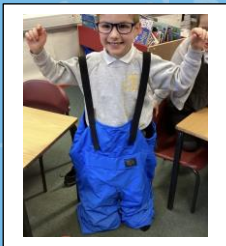
NEWS AND UPDATES: Reading Assembly

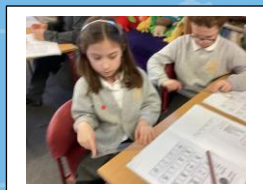


NEWS AND UPDATES:
