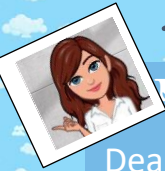

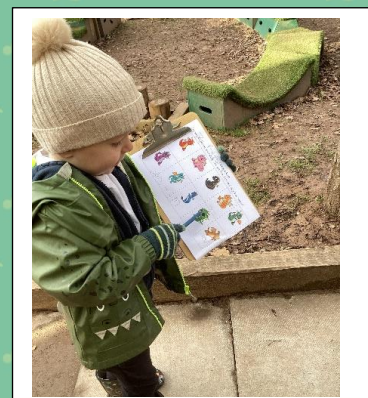
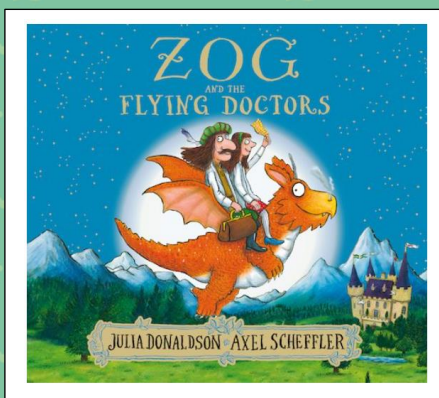

Another fantastic forest school session for 1B this week! Den building, scavenger hunting, leaf threading and spotting signs that spring is not so far away 😊



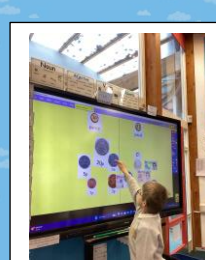
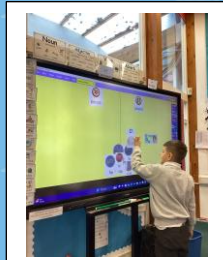
