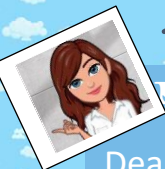

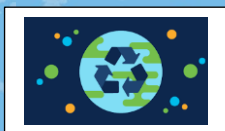


MRS MANNING'S MESSAGE

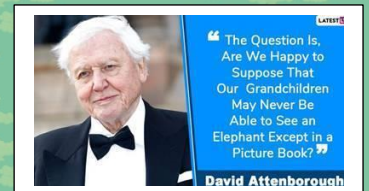
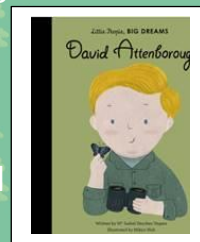

Continuing with the theme of Sustainability, in KS1, Miss Chandler shared 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley'.

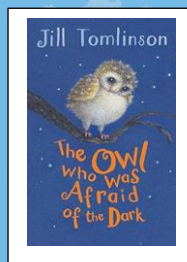
This story inspired the children to Consider the damage plastic can do to wild animals and the importance of repurposing.

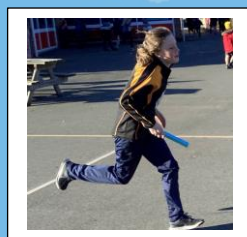


NEWS AND UPDATES:
