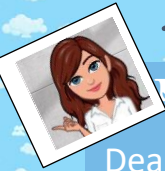

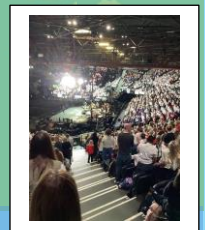
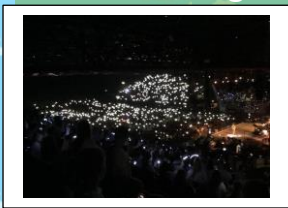

NEWS AND UPDATES:

Year 2 began their exciting new topic about Hereford and our Locality this week. During their first lesson, they learnt all about how to conduct fieldwork... going out in their local area and observing what they can see. They walked around the school site and recorded the different human and physical features. Afterwards, they discussed how they saw lots of houses and flats, which are human features, and in the conservation area there were lots of physical features such as woodland and plants. Well done to all of the children for following our HEART Values throughout.



This week, year 5 have started their new reading book, The Explorer. The children looked at the famous artist Henry Rousseau, they explored how, just like writers, artists use their imagination to bring their work to life! They then sketched and painted their own jungle picture, inspired by 'The Surprise' from Rousseau's collection.
