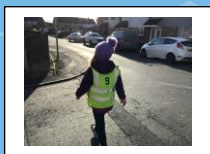


In maths this week, Year 5 have been learning about prime, square and cube numbers. This week, the children used concrete and pictorial representations to help them solve open ended problems. The children modelled their fantastic oracy skills whilst discussing whether or not a number is prime based on how many factors it has.
