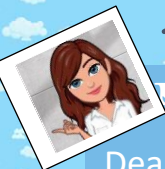

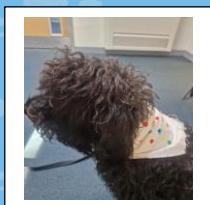


## MRS MANNING'S MESSAGE

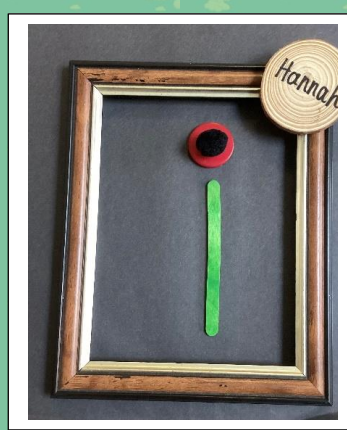

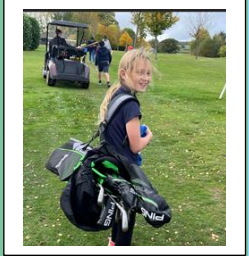

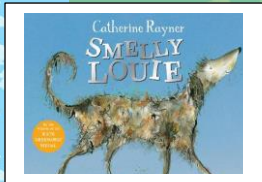
## NEWS AND UPDATES:

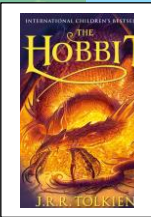


### Reading assemblies
