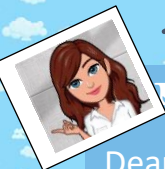

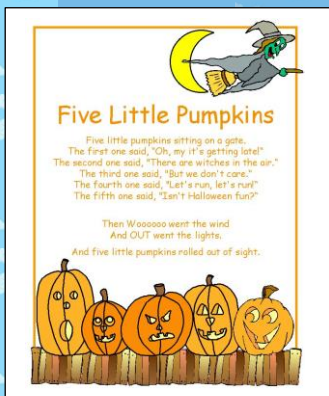
## NEWS AND UPDATES:

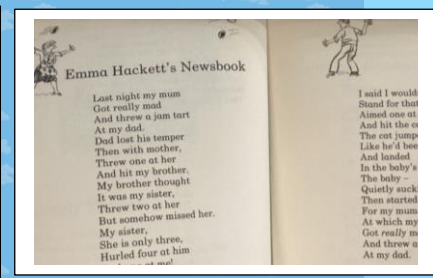
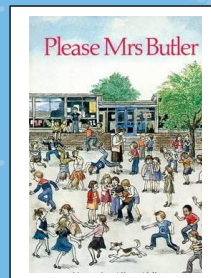


## NEWS AND UPDATES: RECOMMENDED READS

This week in our reading assemblies, Miss Lewis and Miss Chandler shared some of their favourite poetry. In KS2, Miss Lewis shared 'Please Mrs Butler' and she explained to the children: *It was my first encounter with poetry. It was the most popular book in my primary school library and I remember my classmates always hoping it would be on the shelf when it was our turn to visit. My favourite poem is called, 'Emma Hackett's Newsbook', I loved the drama created, humour and the use of rhyme.*



In KS1 reading assembly, Miss Chandler shared some Halloween themed poetry and pulled out the reading raffle winners, who will be taking a trip, next week, to the Children's Bookshelf to choose a book.



**Scientific skills:** In Year 4 science this week, they have been exploring the Question – **are spaces really empty?** They have been studying gases and their properties, and how they compare to solids and liquids. To end the lesson, we used the power of gases to have a game of Blow Football! This half term in science, Year 5 have been learning about Earth & space. They have observed how the moon orbits Our Earth and how its appearance changes during its Monthly cycle. They created origami models of each different moon Phase, identifying the different waxing and waning moons!
