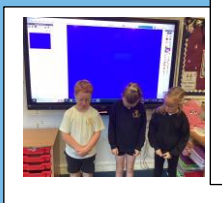


On Thursday, we were visited by Open the Book from the West Hereford churches. They did a fabulous job of bringing to life the Story of Moses and the Exodus and the children enjoyed helping by being the 'moaning Israelites'. We are looking forward to the next story when they visit us again next month.



## NEWS AND UPDATES:

As a school, we have been learning about Zones of Regulation. In Year 2, we looked at which feelings match the different colour zones. For example, green represented ready to learn and feeling happy. However, red was anger! We are learning how we manage our feelings to get into the green zone. We can do things like tell and adult, go on a walk or have a quiet time out when we feel we need to regulate our feelings. We then spoke about how all feelings are ok and valid.



It was back to the 90's in Year 4 this week. Here we have some of our 4G musicians learning how to play the iconic 'Breakfast at Tiffany's' on the ukelele by one-hit wonders, Deep Blue Something.



In Year 3's sentence stacking lesson, the children have been using a thesaurus to find synonyms for 'good' and then decide the intensity of the words by placing them on a shade'o'meter. They found some brilliant words and were able to use them in their writing.
