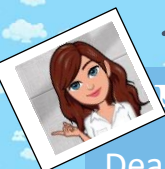

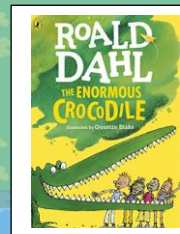
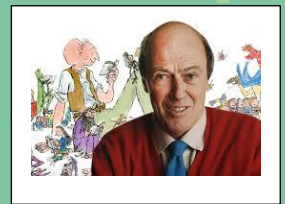

NEWS AND UPDATES: Teacher recommended books

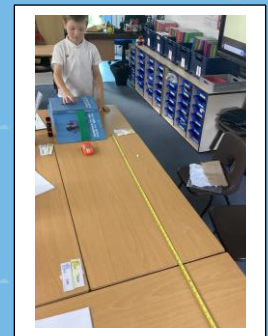
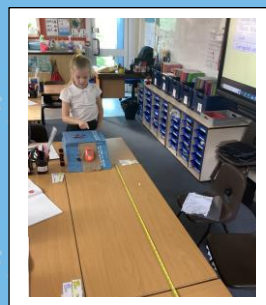
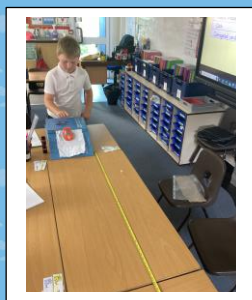
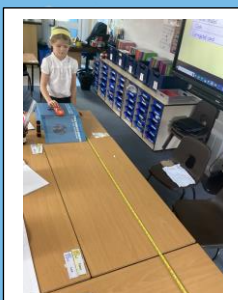
This year, we have re-designed our assembly structure times and focus of each session. Every Thursday, a teacher reads an extract from a treasured book and shares information about the author, why they love the book so much and its importance to them. This week Mr Goodarzi read extracts from two different books by the same author – Roald Dahl. *‘Growing up, I was fascinated by his books – the imaginative plotlines, the gentle humour, the whacky characters, the heroes and villains and the peculiar language he would make up. To our Ks1 children, I read an extract from The Enormous Crocodile, to our KS2 pupils, I read the first chapter of a personal favourite of mine – Fantastic Mr Fox. Although not without controversy, Roald Dahl inspired a generation of readers. Therefore, I urge you to delve deep into his back catalogue of work – no matter how young or not-so-young you might be.’*

NEWS AND UPDATES:

This week in science, Year 3 have continued their work on forces, focusing on the effect friction has on a moving object. They tested 4 different surfaces to see which would allow the car to move the furthest. They made predictions, ensured it was a fair test, then took measurements of the distance the car travelled. Finally, they compared the measurements before explaining their findings. Many correctly predicted the material that would allow the car to travel the furthest but only a few were correct in predicting the material that would cause the car to travel the least amount of distance.



Year 2 loved their Road Safety Workshop from Julie Freeman, part of Herefordshire Council. The children talked about how to cross a road safely, using the saying, ‘Stop, Look, Listen, Think!’ They loved identifying hazards in the video, such as, playing near to a road or not paying attention. They have taken their workbooks home to complete. 😊
