Key Vocabulary

punctual	Arriving or doing something at the correct time, not late
responsible	To have control or be in charge of something. Capable of being trusted.
possession	The condition of having or owning something
appointment	An arrangement to meet someone at a particular time and place.
consent	To give permission or approval, to agree to something
considerate	careful not to inconvenience or harm others

 Can explain why it is important to have a trusting relationship between friends and family.
 Can identify how making some choices can impact others' lives in a negative way.

Working beyond

Knows how we can seek consent from others and why it is important to do this.
 Can explain how being responsible can change as we grow older, and that our responsibilities may be different depending on circumstances.
