## NEWS AND UPDATES: Reading Assemblies

This week we celebrated Safer Internet Day and the book 'Goldilocks – A Hashtag Cautionary Tale'. It is a great way to teach children about being responsible online. Just like Goldilocks learns to make careful choices in the classic story, children need to learn how to make safe choices when using the internet—what is "just right" to share, what to keep private, and how to stay safe online. 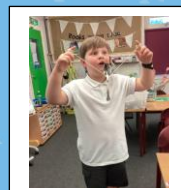


## NEWS AND UPDATES:
