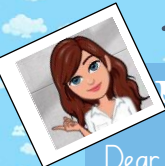

## MRS MANNING'S MESSAGE

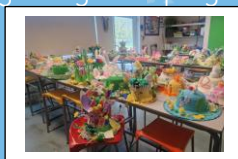
Dear Parents and Carers,

Year 3 have enjoyed exploring capacity, volume and mass this week in practical ways in preparation for our new maths unit "Mass and Capacity". They investigated the capacity of different containers by estimating the capacity of each one, filling them with water and measuring with measuring jugs. They then compared the capacity of different containers as a class and also enjoyed estimating and measuring the mass of different objects around the class using weighing scales. Great engagement year 3!



Year 5 had a fantastic session with the Dogs Trust, where they learned about dog behaviour and how to stay safe around our beloved pets. This was a valuable opportunity to address any fears or misconceptions the children had, especially since 8 out of 10 either own a dog or interact with one regularly.
