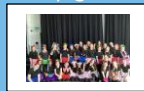


MRS MANNING'S MESSAGE

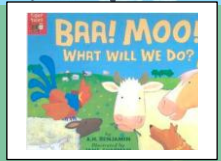


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NEWS AND UPDATES: Reading Assemblies
