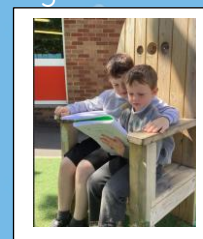
We couldn't be prouder of each and every child – their effort, calmness under pressure, and team spirit have been outstanding.

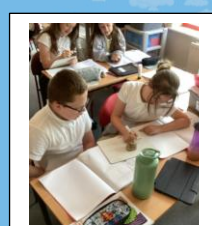


NEWS AND UPDATES:

Year 2 had a fantastic time exploring the field and forest area as part of their science learning on grassland and woodland habitats. They loved becoming nature detectives, hunting for beetles, earthworms, and buttercups. They were full of curiosity and enthusiasm, carefully observing what lives in each environment and talking about the differences between the two habitats.
