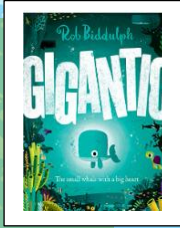

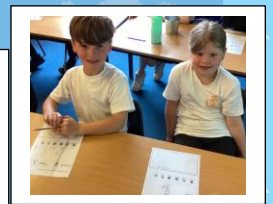
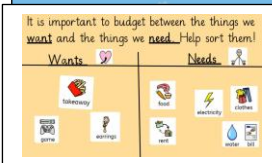
This week is Money Sense Week, and I have chosen to share the book, The Missing Money, from the Money Monster Series. I think this is a great story to share because it introduces the idea of saving and interest. It also shows that what might seem scary or confusing at first can be understood with a little help and the right information!

This week, the children have been engaged in completing a range of money sense activities. They have explored the world of money and gained an understanding of the importance of budgeting, saving, and investing. Through interactive games, group discussions, and real-life scenarios, the children learned how to make thoughtful spending choices and how to prioritise needs over wants. They also practised using coins and notes to solve problems and role-played as shopkeepers and customers to develop their financial literacy skills. These activities have helped to build their confidence in handling money and encouraged them to think critically about managing their finances in everyday life.
