## MRS MANNING'S MESSAGE

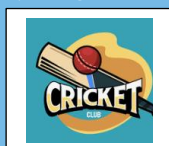
Dear parents & carers,

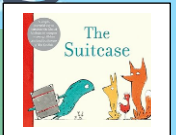
## NEWS AND UPDATES:

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## NEWS AND UPDATES: READING ASSEMBLIES

This week in our reading assembly, I chose to share *The Suitcase* by Chris Naylor-Ballesteros as part of our reflections for Refugee Week. It's a beautiful story with powerful messages about kindness, empathy, and welcoming others, especially those who may be experiencing fear or uncertainty. The story encourages us to look beyond first impressions and to offer support and understanding to people who may be starting a new chapter in an unfamiliar place. This links closely to our HEART value of Respect, reminding us to treat everyone with compassion, fairness, and dignity, no matter their background or story. It was a wonderful opportunity to explore these important themes together. (Miss Dawson, Year 1)

I chose *Wave Me Goodbye* written by Jacqueline Wilson for the KS2 reading assembly because it tells the powerful story of an evacuee during World War Two, capturing the fear, separation, and hope experienced by children forced to leave their homes. This connects to Refugee Week, which we have recognised across the school this week,



as it highlights themes still relevant today such as displacement, resilience, and the impact of war on young lives. We discussed that just like modern refugees, evacuees had to adapt to unfamiliar places and face uncertain futures, making this story a meaningful way to reflect on the shared human experience of seeking safety. 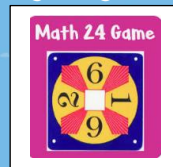
## NEWS AND UPDATES:
