NEWS AND UPDATES:

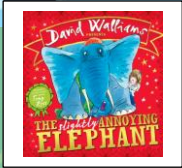

NEWS AND UPDATES: READING ASSEMBLIES

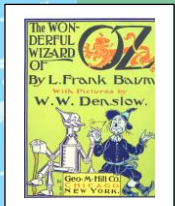
