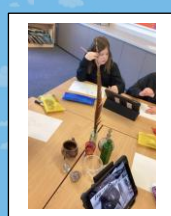
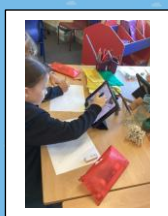
Baton of Hope Comes to Hereford
