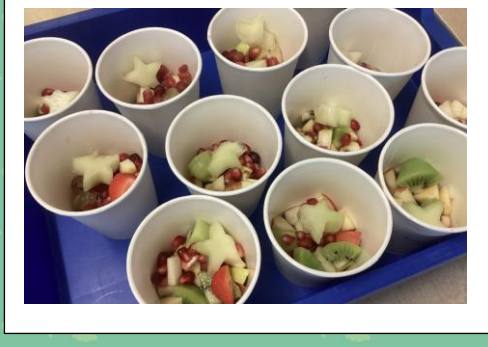

For next term, it will still be cold and wet, so please do provide waterproof coats, wellies and trousers/puddle suit, especially if your child is a fan of muddy play.

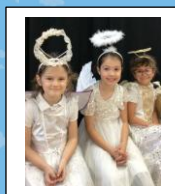
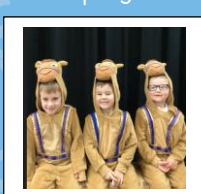
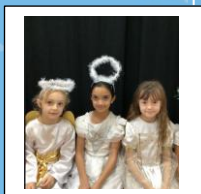


## Sustainability Week 2026
