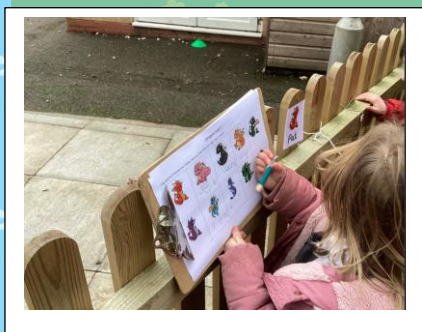

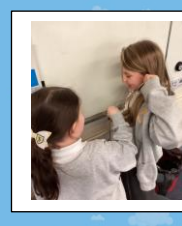
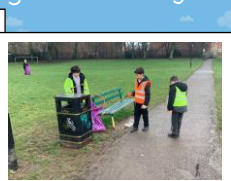


NEWS AND UPDATES:

Year 1 have had a very busy and exciting week! At Forest School IC loved creating their own magical forest school 'porridge' and enjoyed working together while den building. 🌳🍲 Later in the week all of Year 1 showcased their creativity in computing by producing pointillism artwork inspired by the artist Georges Seurat. 🍪 We also demonstrated excellent teamwork and problem-solving skills while working systematically to find number bonds to 20. 🎈



This term, Year 4 have been learning all about sound in Science. As part of our investigations, the children made their own ear gongs using a metal spoon and wool, and discovered that when the spoon is struck, vibrations travel up the string and into the ear, where they reach the eardrum. We also experimented with changing the length of the string and found that a shorter string made the sound louder. This is because the vibrations have less distance to travel. The children then tested their ear gongs by banging them against different surfaces and were fascinated to hear how each surface produced a different sound. This helped them understand that the material an object is made from affects the sound it produces!



Year 5 have had a wonderful week during Sustainability Week! 🌍 The children have continued learning all about Sir David Attenborough in their writing lessons and explored why sustainability is so important ♡, discovering how just one voice can make a positive impact. They then went out into the local community to collect litter, helping to protect our local habitats from the negative effects of pollution. What fantastic eco-champions! 🌱
