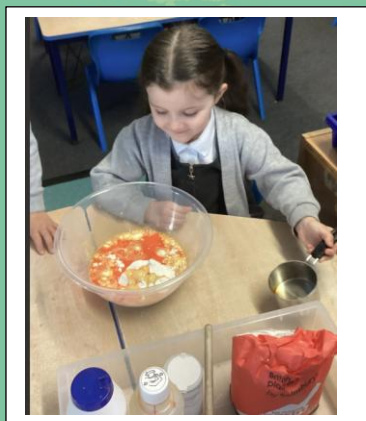

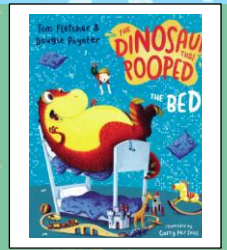

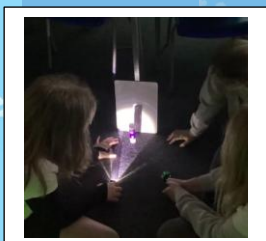
It was an engaging and interactive session designed to help prepare the children for *Poetry By Heart*. Miss Roberts (Year 5)
